

High in fibre

ANY FARMERS WELCOME the presence of a shooting club on their patch. It brings them a little bit of welcome income, in the form of rent - and also provides good security on what may be the farmer's one day off in the week.


They're less pleased, however, if an animal swallows a plastic wad and needs the expensive attention of a vet. But if the shooters use fibre-wadded cartridges there's no problem. Fibre wads get chomped up along with the grass, and the animal's digestive juices do the rest. Complete re-cycling, from one end of the beast to the other!

So this month we're looking at three fibre-wadded clay shooting loads - two from Britain and one from Cyprus.

HULL CHEVRON FIBRE

VICTORY CHALLENGER FELT



HIS IS A VERY SHOULDER-KINDLY load - but don't be fooled by its low muzzle velocity of 1,182 ft/sec! It's quite enough for club clays, and the patterns are super good. Nine-metre observed figure is 990 ft/sec, and pressure is 635.1 bars. Consistency is fantastic: less than 30 ft/sec over the test batch.

The shell is loaded in a translucent green 67mm case with an 7.5mm head, although it requires a 70mm chamber.

Exterior of the case is lightly ribbed, and seal is with a six-star crimp. The one-piece wad has a thick over-powder card beneath it, and the powder is a pale grey flake. Shot is true English 71/2, round and well-polished, with a crush value of 32 per cent good competition shot.



VERDICT

A super shell for clays out to medium range. Just what the clubman ordered!

Just what the farmer ordered - a cow-friendly wad.

HIS IS A GOOD ONE IF YOU HAVE a game gun and shoot occasional clays, because the 67mm burgundy-coloured case can be shot through 21/2 in. chambers. It has an 8mm brass head, is virtually smooth on

the outside, and is closed with a six-star crimp.

Like the Hull shell, the fibre wad has a thick over-powder card, and the propellent is a very fine-grained grey powder which provides a pressure of 587.9 bars.

Shot was generally spot on size for English 71/2, and the few slightly undersize pellets were nothing to worry about. Crush value was 37 per cent.

Muzzle velocity was 1,381.2 ft/sec, with an observed figure of 1,146.9 recorded 9 metres down-range.



VERDICT

A great all-rounder, and a super shell for those shorter chambers.

Whatever next grass flavoured wadding material?

HE WAD ISN'T FELT; IT'S FIBRE - a pernickerty point to make about the Cyprus-made shell which was the fastest in the trio. It clocked a muzzle velocity of 1,416.9 ft/sec, and a down-range observed figure of 1,115.5. That's top-line trap shell performance. Pressure was a relatively lively 661 bars.*

Case is 68mm, requiring 70mm chambers, and is mid-green with a lightly-ribbed surface and a deep, 16mm brass head. Seal is with a six-star crimp, and propellent is a sage-coloured, round flake.

The shot - glory be for an imported cartridge! - was true English 71/2, and was a good sample with a crush value of 34 per cent. Under it was a single-piece wad with no supplementary cards.

A good shell for those longer

targets.
